He is just saying that the Confederate Monument should stay because it never hurt anyone until the black movement came down and desired that it be removed from the courthouse lawn. He further explained how the black movement has operated. He thinks that it needs to stay where it is and maybe sometime some of the chaos will wind down. He closed his remarks by saying that Red Skelton said that God put us on this earth to build up and not to tear down.
