X. TAX LEVY

Section 1: There is hereby levied a tax at the rate of 44ϕ (forty-four cents) per one hundred dollars (\$100) valuation of property listed for taxes as of January 1, 2011 for the purpose of raising the revenue listed as "Budget Year's Taxes" in the General Fund - Part I, Section 2 of this Ordinance.

Section 2: This rate of tax is based on an estimated total valuation of property for the purpose of taxation of \$1,626,715,116 and an estimated collection rate of 96.12%.
