Area Youth Learn Life Skills

North Carolina Cooperative Extension along with the help of many volunteers held the 74th Annual Albemarle Area 4-H Livestock Show and Sale in Elizabeth City on April 23-24. Over 180 youth participated by showing either goats, steers, heifers, lambs or pigs. Livestock Show Youth representing Perquimans, Pasquotank, Gates, Camden, and Currituck Counties spend 5-6 months working with their animal by feeding, grooming and practicing for their moment to shine in the show ring. The participant compete in two categories Market Judging which determines how well the animal looks, and Showmanship, which shows how well the child works with the animal. Youth learn animal science basics, leadership, dedication and financial responsibility.
