Now is the time to apply for the \$1,000.00 NC State - Lewis Smith Agriculture Scholarship. Lewis Smith, served the community as the County Extension Director for the North Carolina Cooperative Extension Service for over thirty years. Following his retirement in December 2013, individuals from the local Farm Bureau Office, the Extension Office, the NC State Foundation, and local farmers formed a committee to establish an educational scholarship in his name.
