Maggie Williams is the 2020 recipient of the \$1,000.00 NC State - Lewis Smith Agriculture Scholarship. Lewis Smith, served the community as the County Extension Director for the North Carolina Cooperative Extension Service for over thirty years. Following his retirement in December 2013, individuals from the local Farm Bureau Office, the Extension Office, the NC State Foundation, and local farmers formed a committee to establish an educational scholarship in his name. Maggie is the daughter of Jeff and Bonita Williams of Perquimans County and the granddaughter of (late) Billy and Hollis Williams of Tyner and Billy and Diane Barclift of Elizabeth City. She will be the third generation to attend NCSU for agriculture, following in her dad and her granddad's footprints. Granddaddy Billy Williams loved NCSU. Armyworms get our attention...

The fall is quickly approaching with that comes the nasty pest "fall armyworms". Fall armyworms can be devastating to pastures especially bermudagrass pastures and newly planted fall pastures. Starting mid August through the early fall scout your pastures and hayfields regularly to make sure you are not at threshold. If you do have them in your pastures and hayfields use this link Insecticides for a recommendation on the options that we have to spray in North Carolina.
