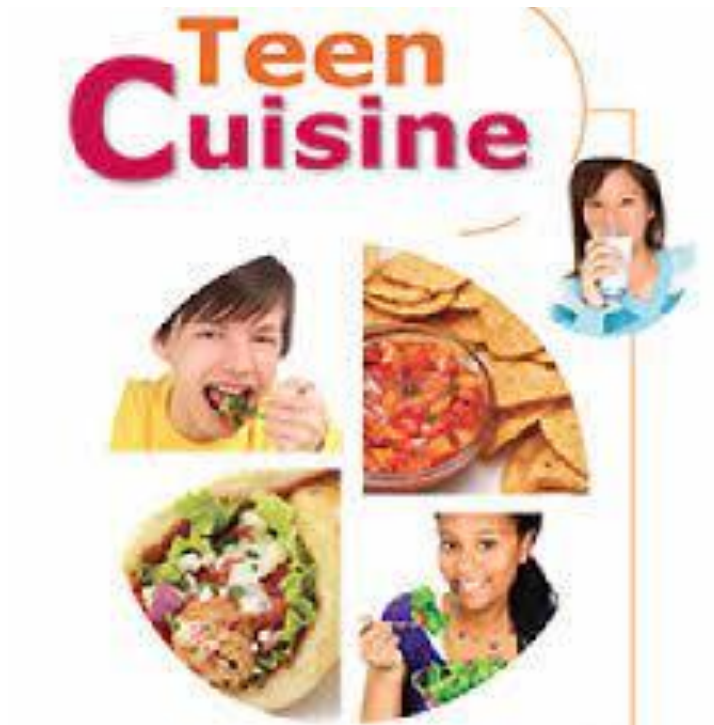

Why do I need to take a soil sample for my pasture? That may be a question you ask yourself from time to time. The answer is to know how much lime and fertilizer is needed. You can apply the same amount of fertilizer each year if you wish, but you may be applying more than you need, or not applying enough. It is especially important to take a soil sample to know how much lime to apply. The lime is applied to get the soil to the desired pH for the crop you have planted. Each type of grass or forage requires a specific pH level for optimum growth. If the pH is too low, or even too high, other nutrients are not as readily available to the plant. This can cause the plant to be weak and unhealthy, and not yield as much forage as it would when the pH is at optimum levels.

The soil test will also tell how much fertilizer to apply. It will give an analysis of fertilizer that is best suited for the forage. If you apply without a soil test, you may be wasting money by applying too much of one of the nutrients. Fertilizer dealers can make the fertilizer blend to match what the soil test calls for. The soil test will also tell you if any of the micro nutrients are lacking in the soil. If so, you can add the needed micronutrients when the blended fertilizer is made.

The best time to take your soil sample is in the early winter. The NCDA lab will charge \$4 per sample from December to March. Getting one taken early will not only help you avoid a sample fee, but also get your information back early, giving you more time to plan for spring.
