Crape Myrtle Bark Scare



Local residents are likely to notice the presence of Crape Myrtle Bark Scale on crape myrtle trees. The small insects (pictured) attach to the bark of trees and, as they feed, excrete a sticky "honeydew" residue. Residents may first notice the problem because of the black "sooty mold" that grows on the honeydew and covers the branches and leaves of infected trees. 

Free Soil Samples until November 30th!



The peak-season soil testing fee of \$4 is set to take effect on December 1st! Collecting soil samples only takes a few minutes and has many benefits. It can save money in the upkeep of your lawn, garden, and landscape. Analysis of nutrients in your soil, and determining what enrichments may be necessary, can result in healthier plants and as a result will protect water quality by preventing unnecessary fertilizer applications. Soil Sample Kits are available weekdays at the Perquimans County Extension Center from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM. Bring your sample to our office for free shipment to the NCDA Soil Lab.
