Mycotoxins

Over the past several weeks the Perquimans Extension Office has been receiving many calls on Mycotoxins in animal feeds. Mycotoxins can have many symptoms from mild cases to death, depending on the levels in the feed. Below is a great resource to use once a feed sample has been taken.

Guide to Mycotoxins Commonly Found in Animal Feeds

Mycotoxin	Predominant Fungi Species	FDA Action Level (Varies by species/feed)	Common Crops	Symptoms
Aflatoxin	Aspergillus	Feed: 20 ppb Milk: 5 ppb	Corn, cottonseed, peanuts, cereal grains	Increased somatic cell count (SCC), lethargy, rough hair coat, jaundice, and potential reduction in intake and milk yield
Fumonisin	Fusarium	Corn/corn byproducts: 30 ppm and < 50% of diet	Corn	Increased SCC, lethargy, reduced intake, and reduced milk production
Zearalenone	Fusarium	Not applicable	Corn and wheat (can also occur in oats, rice, rye, sorghum, barley)	Decreased fertility, abnormal estrous cycles, swollen vulva, vaginitis, enlarged mammary gland (in heifers), and reduced milk yield
Ochratoxin A	Aspergillus, Penicillium	Not applicable	Cereal grains	More problems in calves or when fed high grain diets: potential abortions or death
<u>Deoxynivalenol</u> (<u>DON; Vomitoxin</u>)	Fusarium	Grain/grain byproducts: 5 ppm	Corn, wheat (straw), cereal grains	Diarrhea, reduced intake, and reduced milk yield
Tricothecenes (T- 2 Toxin)	Fusarium	Not applicable	Corn	Diarrhea, reduced intake, reduced milk yield, ataxia, and anorexia
PR Toxin	Penicillium	Not applicable	Corn (silage) and grass	Reduced milk and fat production, and acidosis-like symptoms
<u>Patulin</u>	Aspergillus, Penicillium, Byssochlamys	Not applicable	Silage	Tremors, ataxia, paresis, recumbency, and death
Ergot Alkaloids	Claviceps, Epichloë, Neotyphodium	Not applicable	Fescue grass, sorghum, small grains	Impaired thermoregulation, reduced intake, reduced milk yield, and abortions
